MEDICAL POLICY

The City of Leominster Recreation Department will not prohibit any person’s participation in an activity due to a medical condition or handicap, unless such condition is likely to cause injury to those individuals or other participants in that activity. A participant, who has been notified by a qualified medical professional, that he/she has a medical condition that is likely to cause injury to themselves or other participants, is obligated to inform the Leominster Recreation Department. This should be done at the time of registration and willingly withdraw from the program and/or activity if requested by the Department. You must also sign a release form for any activity you may be participating in and release the Recreation Department from any responsibility if an accident were to occur.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Walk-in registrations begin on September 8, 2009. Our hours are Monday – Wednesday & Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., and Thursday 8:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. Registrations are done on a first come first served basis with priority given to Leominster residents. The Recreation Department reserves the right to cap the registrations for any program based on availability of personnel, facilities, or any other factors affecting the programs. **All registrations are *NON-REFUNDABLE.**

**A \$20 handling fee will be charged if a refund becomes necessary. Please make note of this important policy.*

REGISTRATION POLICIES – Read Carefully

- Registration is done on a first- come, first serve basis, with priority given to Leominster residents. The Recreation Department reserves the right to cap the registrations for any program based on availability of personnel and facilities or any other factors affecting the programs.
- **Non-residents wishing to register** for a non-trip program will be allowed only if space permits, with **a \$5.00 increase in fee.** Non-residents will be placed on a waiting list and notified when space becomes available.
- For a trip program, a deadline will be set for six (6) weeks prior to the scheduled trip for residents to have priority over non-residents. After the deadline, registrations will then be open to everyone for one week. If the trip is not filled to capacity, it may be cancelled at that point and all money will be refunded. It is important to register early to ensure that a trip will take off.
- If registration is received by mail and there are no openings in that program, you will be put on a waiting list and contacted by phone. We will return your checks if no openings arise.

There is a \$25 service charge for all returned checks.

Fall and Winter Hiking Programs 2010-2011

The Leominster Recreation Department, Leominster Trail Stewards, The Leominster Conservation Commission, and the Friends of Sholan Farms all offer hikes throughout the year. Visit www.leominstertrailsteward.org or contact the Recreation Department for the list of hikes being held each month and meeting points.

The following hikes will be offered:

The Women's Hiking Series offers hikes for women through Leominster's Monoosnoc Hills or on various trails requested by the hikers the second Thursday of each month from 9:00 a.m. until approximately noon. Additional hikes for women may also be offered at various times of the year.

The Leominster Trail Steward Hikes- will be held on the trails in Leominster at various times and days throughout the year for families and adults. Occasionally, special guided hikes will be offered at locations outside of the City.

Monthly Twilight Hikes at Sholan Farms (weather permitting) (8:00-10:00 p.m.)

The Friends of Sholan Farms offer a series of night hikes which take place on the second Friday of each month. Gathering time is at 8:00 PM at the Farm Stand area - 1 hour hike with a 1 hour campfire (as conditions allow). Bring a friend or family members (pets on leashes are welcome) to enjoy the hike. Comfortable hiking attire is recommended, as well as a flashlight, and water. For after the hike, bring your favorite treat (hotdogs, marshmallows, etc) to share. LEARN TO SKATE- ICE SKATING PROGRAM

Learn to Skate program at the Landry Arena at the Wallace Civic Center in Fitchburg, MA is an excellent introduction to ice skating for children. Skaters are taught basic coordination, balance and maneuverability on the ice in a weekly 40 minute group lesson. In the Tot classes, instructors use songs, games, toys and other fun methods to cater to the learning styles and development of children ages 2.5 – 5 years. The Youth program is for ages 6-12 years where skaters learn the essentials of skating including gliding, pushing, stopping and stroking in a fun and enjoyable atmosphere. Program Level Ages Level Description

Pre-Tot 2.5 – 3 years: For tot skaters who have little or no formal skating experience. Emphasis is on introducing little ones to the ice.

Tot 1 4 – 5 years: For skaters ages 4 – 5 years who have little or no formal skating experience and younger tots who have mastered the skills in Pre-Tot. Emphasis is on basic mobility.

Youth 1 6 – 12 years: For skaters with little or no formal skating experience. Emphasis is on coordination, balance and mobility on the ice.

Teen/Adult 13 years & up: For skaters 13 years and older who wish to learn how to skate or advance their current skating skills.
